PARTIAL LIST OF PROJETCS TO BE FUNDED: Repaint the Interior of the Church, Re-carpet the Church, Remove dead or dying trees from Church Property, Palm tree trimming and care, Repair bricks in patio after tree is removed, Replace exterior Doors and Panic Bar Hardware, Replace Evap Coolers in Lobby, Library, and Blessed Sacrament Chapel, Re-pad, reupholster, and repair kneelers, Replace AC Unit in Dominican Residence, Lawn/Sprinkler and landscape work, Repair to roof on south side of building, Re-carpet Lobby and Halls in Newman Center, Furniture for Lobby and Library, Replace Sign in front of Center/new signage, Repair weather Damage to Ramada, Repair weather and termite damage to Dominican Residence.
