Father Bart Hutcherson, has been invited to serve as Spiritual Director on an 11 day Holy Land Pilgrimage. He will co-lead with Mrs. Erin Blanchette, the director of Vine of Grace, a local

women's spirituality ministry. The pilgrimage will visit many of the sites in Galilee, Nazareth, Bethlehem and Jerusalem associated with the life and ministry of Jesus. Additionally, it will visit numerous sites associated with the Hebrew Scriptures and our religious heritage. The cost of the trip is \$3996 per person. This price will include airfare (from Phoenix), all lodging (double occupancy) and ground transportation in Israel, all breakfasts and dinners, all portage fees, tips. NEWMAN CENTER REGISTRATION

We are currently in the process of updating our database for 2012-2013. Even if you are currently registered with Newman **you MUST re-register**. We have such a transient community that it is necessary to update our database every year. Many people assume since they attend church every week they are registered.

Why should you be a registered member?

Here are a few examples:

- To get married or have a child baptized at Newman you need to be registered 6 months prior to the wedding or enrolling in our baptism classes and scheduling a baptism
- To enroll your child in Religious Education you need to be registered
- If you ever need a letter stating you're a member in good standing at Newman and you are not registered, we will not be able to provide one for you
- To receive mailings from Newman you must be registered
- To obtain a Newman Center Parking Permit you must be registered
