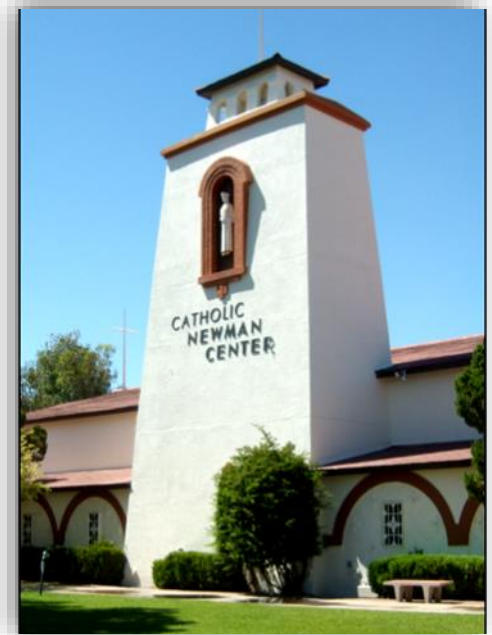

Fr. John Paul's Spiritual Brew

To be awake and sober.... To be ready to go when God calls us....

The older I get, the more I am in search of meaningful conversations and relationships. There are so many words spoken, written, emailed, texted, tweeted, and broadcasted at all hours of the day and night. We are soaked with information about everything and everyone. In some ways... this is a gift to have so much 'ease of communication' at our disposal.... In other ways, it is exhausting.... to have to process so much information either willingly or passively.

In our first reading from the Book of Wisdom... we hear that "wisdom" is "resplendent and unfading; readily perceived by those who seek her, and found by those who look for her; that she can be discovered at the dawn... waiting by the gate.... for all in search of her"

Wisdom goes beyond simple information... It is the fruit of our discernment and 'wading through' all that knowledge provides through our information sources. Wisdom is 'a call to pray' ...over and over... with the knowledge that we gather.... and to see what *light 'rises' from it... 'to illuminate our way forward' into loving action in the world.

In our Gospel there are wise and foolish people hoping to meet the bridegroom. The wise are those who took the time to be prepared... Those who allowed themselves to wake up, and to sober up.... so that they were not distracted by the chaos, that can sometimes be a part of life, so, that they were 'ready to go' when the time came to do so.

May we have the courage, to love God, with ALL that we are, lifting the fog.... of too much information. May we focus on being 'awake and sober' to receive God's love and wisdom.... in our dreams and plans. Amen!

CORPORATE BOARD SECRETARY ELECTION NOTICE

CANDIDATES REQUIREMENTS:

Candidates for election must be lay persons who are:

- ◆ Catholic
- ◆ Registered, practicing parish members
- ◆ At least 25 years old.

WHO CAN NOMINATE A CANDIDATE?

The pastor may nominate up to two persons, including the board member whose term is expiring. Other nominations may be made in writing by at least 10 registered parishioners in full communion with the Roman Catholic Church.

All nominations are to be made at least 2 weeks before the election and announced at Sunday Masses two weeks prior to the election date of **January 17, 2021**. If only one person has been nominated by then, the nominee shall be declared elected.

ELECTION COMMITTEE

At the time of the notice of the election, the Pastor shall appoint an election committee to receive nominations, prepare ballots, act as tellers and supervise the election.
