Fr. John Paul's Spiritual Brew

do will it... be made clean! These words of Jesus always stop me in my tracks.. They are the words and actions of a compassionate person.

Lepers were outcast. Their disease was something that was feared as being both a physical, and spiritual reason to be "unclean" and therefore to be separated from the community. This was for both spiritual and health reasons, and leper's were outcasts.

To be "unclean" physically" could effect other healthy members of the community. And, the same was true "spiritually". To be a leper could also mean that there was 'a stain of sin' on your family that got passed down through generations, and that people and their loved ones should have nothing to do with you. Talk about 'social distancing!

Jesus' action in today Gospel was revolutionary! He knew the Mosaic Law deeply, and all that was required. But, he also knew the law of God, as "true man and true God" and all that God's Eternal Law required. It is from this place and spirit that Jesus reaches out and says, "I do will it... be made clean."

So, what about us in these days prior to the beginning of Lent, this Wednesday? What needs to be deeply touched and made clean?

In these on going days of pandemic we are invited to continue to use charity in our social distancing, and not to become indifferent, intolerant, and without concern for one another. In today's second reading St. Paul reminds us that we are to be "imitators of Christ" always! For this is what it means to truly fulfill the Law!

As we prepare to enter the Lenten Season this Wednesday may we be inspired by these Sunday readings, and to do our "little bit" in reaching out and touching whatever 'Dis-Ease' needs God's healing touch through us.

I leave you with the words of Sr. Thea Bowman, OSF who will be among the six Black Catholic Americans to be Canonized soon. "I think the difference between me and some people is that I am content to do my little bit. Sometimes people think they have to do big things in order to make change. But if each one would light a candle we'd have a tremendous light."

Fear is useless... What is needed is trust! Amen.
