Fr. John Paul's Spiritual Brew

here is an authority that Jesus always spoke with... that got people to stop and listen. His words penetrated the minds, hearts, and souls... of all walks of life... that he encountered. The Scriptures tell us that he calmed the sea, and spoke to unclean spirits... and they obeyed... because he told them...... and, that when he uttered a word of healing... people found wholeness.....
