ou give them something to eat."

Self preservation is a natural human tendency that effects all of us at different times in our lives. I saw this often when I was a student brother going through formation and studies for the priesthood.

This would usually occur post some grand celebration that we would host for our guests for ordinations, final vows, or Christmas/Easter. An announcement would be made, "Please join us for a reception in the backyard of the Priory". As the closing song was cueing up, the friars would sing a verse or two, and then we would make our way through the crowds to make sure we got our fill at the tables and treats which we had slaved to set up for our guests.

Jesus in today's Gospel sees the deeper needs of those who have been following him for days. The more he preaches, teaches, and heals... the larger the crowds become. They appear desperate for his words and presence...

Jesus although tired himself, sees the physical need for those following him to eat, and does not dismiss this need back to the crowds to fulfill. He points it out to his inner circle, and invites them into a ministry of feeding.

The situation seems impossible... How can we feed this crowd with so little? Jesus witnesses to his disciples what can happen when we invite trust of God into our discernment of what may appear impossible. The people are fed, and there is an abundance left over, which is not to be wasted.

This beautiful story reminds us that it is possible to feed others, and to also be fed ourselves. God invites us to consider the needs of others, even when this can appear overwhelming and impossible. May we have the courage to rise above our own personal hungers, and share food and real presence with others.
